

Roll - a - dress-up Instructions

Room set up:

Write these two “starting sentences” on the wall white board for kids to copy down:

The turkey gobbled.

I ate the potatoes.

Each team should have:

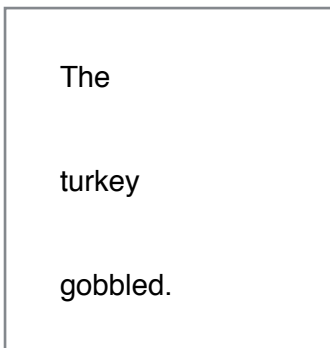
- 1) Dry erase board and pen
- 2) copy of quality adverbs
- 3) copy of quality adjectives
- 4) copy of vocabulary words and definitions
- 5) Roll - a - dress-up card
- 6) one die

Note:

www.asia.wub stands for when, while, where, as since, if although, whereas, unless, because.

How to play:

- 1) Kids should copy one of the sentences on their white board with plenty of space between the words to add “dress-ups.” It could even look like this:



- 2) Kids can work as a team of 2 or 3.
- 3) Kids roll their die and add a dress-up according to the number they rolled.
- 4) Repeat until at least 10 dress-ups have been added.
- 5) Erase board for next set of students.

Multiple groups of kids can play this at the same time with their own white board, die, and marker.
